Donations:

Items that can be donated to Moscone:

- Signage, such as honeycomb cardboard or “meterboard” is reused by art and school groups in the city.
- Banners, vinyl or fabric, can be reused and upcycled by a nonprofit that Moscone works with.
- Promotional tee shirts, tote bags, pens, knapsacks/backpacks, magnets, reusable cloth bags.
- Tables and couches must be shrink wrapped to pallets by general service contractor to be donated.

-Paper, including magazines, catalogues, brochures, and pamphlets cannot be donated, it must be recycled in the blue bins.

-Shopping bags are trash unless they are reusable long lasting cloth bags. Plastic shopping bags cannot be donated or recycled.
