

ELECTRICAL SAFETY CODE & TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS SUBMISSION

- 1) For electrical needs **exceeding 208V and/or 30 AMPS**, please submit your complete electrical requirements to techno@congresmtl.com, serviceinfo@ges.com, and copy coey@sme.org to access feasibility.
- 2) If you are using **European equipment**, please inform techno@congresmtl.com, serviceinfo@ges.com, and copy coey@sme.org and provide the technical specifications for compatibility assessment.
- 3) For **plumbing and pneumatic requirements**, please send detailed specifications to techno@congresmtl.com, serviceinfo@ges.com, and copy coey@sme.org ensure proper support and infrastructure are available for your installation. **Adapters or specific connectors must be foreseen without which the installation may not be feasible.**

ELECTRICAL SAFETY CODE

- 1) If you wish to **display, offer for sale, or use any electrical equipment which is not now certified/approved, a sign must be attached to the machine indicating it has not been approved for sale or rental as required by the regulations respecting electrical installations in Quebec, Article 6.**
- 2) The Electrical Safety Code requires that all electrical equipment must be approved before it may sold or otherwise disposed of or used in Canada. For more information about CSA Special Inspection/Field Evaluation approval please contact the CSA Group Special Inspections Department at (514) 428-2414.
- 3) **It is, therefore, the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that all electrical equipment in, on, or about his booth comply with these regulations. This includes electrical merchandise as well as lighting and display equipment.**
- 4) Electrical equipment for which approval is sought can be submitted to CSA Group. The approval of this Association is acceptable to all electrical inspection authorities in Canada. You are referred to them for all details of procedure.
- 5) **One of the fundamental requirements for certification is that appropriate approval markings appear on each device. If such markings are missing, the device must be considered unapproved and, therefore, subject to special inspections. - 6) Failure to comply could result in the equipment being refused connection to the source of electrical supply and may even be ordered removed from display.
